

Grants: Guidelines and Eligibility Criteria

Brian Chambers Soils Fund

Eligibility	This grant is available to support students or early career scientists based in the

	UK, who are studying or researching or are employed in a position where an
	understanding of soil science, nutrient or manure management, relevant to
	sustainable agricultural production in the UK is an important component.
	Membership of a relevant professional body such as BSSS is not compulsory but
	is an advantage.
Description	The Brian Chambers Soils Fund (BCSF) has been established to recognise the
	significant contribution of Professor Brian Chambers to soil science and its
	applications. The aim of the Fund is to help support the training and experience
	of early career scientists studying or working on applied aspects of soil, nutrient
	or manure management for sustainable agricultural production in the UK. The
	aim of the Fund is to ensure that essential applied soil science skills and
	knowledge are sustained for the future.
Value	Grants will normally be awarded of between £250 and £2,500.
	The fund aims to be flexible and exceptional requests may be considered.
Application Deadlines	Applications are reviewed on a quarterly basis and applicants will be notified of
	the outcome within 28 days of the review. As there are limited funds available,
	applicants are encouraged to apply earlier in the year to ensure funds remain
	available.

Funded activities may include:	 There are no restrictions on the type of activity for which a grant is requested e.g. desk based, laboratory or field research, a technical exchange visit or conference attendance Applications which take place outside of the UK will be eligible but the activity must be relevant to the BCSF technical areas and their application to sustainable agricultural production in the UK Conference or training fees, travel and subsistence costs, hire of facilities, purchase of equipment or materials and other justifiable costs will be
	considered.
The following must be met for the application to be considered:	The applicant must be able to demonstrate that the award will help to further their knowledge and career.

David S Jenkinson Fellowship Grant

Eligibility	This grant is only available to Early Career members of BSSS. The grant can only
	be used to fund a visit by a UK researcher oversees.

	reflects the diverse interests of David's own research. In doing so the Society
	wishes to foster new collaborative relationships between UK-based soil scientists
	and internationally-acclaimed research organisations and soil scientists. Through
	this, we hope to build enduring scientific relationships, to enhance career
	development, and to support UK soil science.
	The award is offered annually to early career postdoctoral scientists within the
	first five years post-PhD award. The Society recognises that this group of
	scientists has few opportunities to apply for grants and is a group that David very
	much enjoyed mentoring and encouraging.
Value	Up to £5,000 to cover travel and subsistence primarily.
	The proposed project will usually involve research activities carried out by the
	host organisation, with the possibility of follow-up work in the UK or on a
	subsequent visit. Hosts must be outside the UK, but are otherwise unrestricted.

	institutions within the United Kingdom.
Description	This grant is available to encourage teachers within primary, secondary and
	tertiary settings to develop innovative ways of incorporating soil science into
	lessons. The aim of the grant is to promote good practice in teaching soil science
	and to support teaching that is innovative, inspiring and intellectually
	stimulating.
	The grant is available to enable teachers to develop and resource innovative
	teaching and learning activities and/ or to undertake research to evaluate
	methods of teaching soil science. This can be achieved in many different ways
	and can include projects based in or outside the classroom.

Value	Up to £250
Application Deadlines	Applications are reviewed on a quarterly basis and applicants will be notified of
	the outcome within 28 days of the review. As there are limited funds available,
	applicants are encouraged to apply earlier in the year to ensure funds remain
	available.

Eligibility	This grant is only available to Early Career members of the British Society of Soil
	Science.
Description	This grant is available to support Early Career members, by covering some of the
	cost of attending relevant national and international conferences and workshops,
	either in person or virtually.
Value	Up to £500
Application Deadlines	Applications are reviewed on a quarterly basis and applicants will be notified of
	the outcome within 28 days of the review. As there are limited funds available,
	applicants are encouraged to apply earlier in the year to ensure funds remain
	available.
The following must be	Applications will be considered from all Early Career members, including
